



Agile Project Management Certification Series: Advanced Certified ScrumMaster

The Scrum Alliance has restructured their advanced certification path, providing role-specific advanced learning programs to allow individuals to develop beyond the foundation provided in the Certified ScrumMaster (CSM) course. After becoming a CSM, the Advanced Certified ScrumMaster (A-CSM) is the next step in your development journey, broadening and deepening ScrumMaster skills to bring your practice to the next level.



Who Should Attend?

Scrum Alliance Certified ScrumMasters (CSM) who are interested in advancing their skills to the next level including those who are interested in advancing towards the Scrum Alliances guide level certifications including Certified Teams Coach, Certified Enterprise Coach, and Certified Scrum Trainer.

Objectives

Through this coaching-based program, individuals will work to satisfy the Learning Objectives (LOs) outlined by the Scrum Alliance. Using a Scrumlike approach individuals will use the LOs as a backlog, progressing through them at their own pace with an emphasis on developing validated competence in the related skills. Graduates of the program will be submitted to the Scrum Alliance to be recognized as Advanced Certified ScrumMasters.

This coaching-based program uses a competencybased model, whereby individuals will develop and demonstrate competency across the approximately 50 Learning Objectives the Scrum Alliance has identified for the Advanced Certified ScrumMaster. Using the LOs as a product backlog the learner will work with the coach to establish the order in which they will complete the LOs and the acceptance criteria that will be used to validate that the LOs have been satisfied. Unlike classroom-based training that can only provide exposure to concepts, this coaching-based program focuses on developing competence in the LOs over time in a real-world context, with goals, learning, validation, and reflection resulting in genuine capability.

Generalized learning objectives that are covered during this program include:

- 1. Lean, Agile & Scrum
 - a. Agile and Lean Values, Principles, and Worldview
 - b. Empirical Process Control
- 2. Agile Facilitation
 - a. Basic Facilitation
- 3. Agile Coaching
 - a. Coaching Fundamentals
- 4. Service to the Development Team
 - a. Self-organization
 - b. Team Dynamics
 - c. Definition of Done
 - d. Value of Engineering Practices
- 5. Service to the Product Owner
 - a. Coaching the Product Owner
- 6. Service to the Organization
 - a. Resolving Impediments
 - b. Scaling Scrum
 - c. Organizational Change
- 7. Scrum Mastery
 - a. Personal Development
 - b. Servant Leadership

Participants are estimated to need 60 hours or more to complete the program, typically spread out over several months (participants may take up to one year, maximum, to complete the program). The program includes a maximum of 26 hours of 1:1 coaching time.
